Prompt: In To Kill a Mockingbird, there are many examples of prejudice. In the novel, Harper Lee shows the terrible effects that prejudice has on people, including the main characters.

In a well-developed 5 paragraph essay, provide evidence to support this statement. Remember to include specific details and examples in the form of quotations (cited in MLA format) from the novel in your essay.

Today, as a class, we will come up with a thesis. Tomorrow, you will get an outline. The body paragraphs will already be filled out. Your responsibility will be to write the introduction and the conclusions and then formulate the information into a coherent essay in MLA format. As you write, remember your essay will be scored based on how well you:

- · Construct your introduction: your hook and your transition from hook to thesis statement.
- Construct your conclusion: restating the thesis in new words, relating back to your hook, and explaining why this topic is important.
- Blend your quotations from the text and cite them properly in MLA format.
- use well-structured sentences and language that are appropriate for your audience.
- Edit your work to conform to the conventions of standard American English.

Examples of quotations in MLA format:

- Lee uses Atticus's words of wisdom, "You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view until you climb inside of his skin and walk around in it," to teach his children compassion (Lee 35).
- Atticus shows great understanding and empathy when he shares his reasoning: "You never really understand a
 person until you consider things from his point of view until you climb inside of his skin and walk around in it"
 (Lee 35).
- Lee reveals the depth of Atticus's character: "You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view - until you climb inside of his skin and walk around in it" (Lee 35).

*Don't forget to explain how each quote relates back to your topic sentence/thesis statement.
